Chapter 22 – Hide & Seek

J: Chapter 22 – Hide and Seek. It had taken much less time than I had thought. All the terror, the despair, the shattering of my heart. The minutes were ticking by more slowly than usual. Jasper still hadn't come back when I returned to Alice. I'm Julia Argy.

V: And I'm Vanessa Zoltan.

J: And this is *Hot and Bothered – Twilight in Quarantine*.

J: [laughing] Yeah, well, after those chapters in the hotel room we really had to pick up some speed.

V: Okay, can you count me in?

J: Three, two, one, go!

V: So, Bella needs to trick everybody and run away. So she tells Jasper 'Come with me to get food' and she goes to the bathroom and goes on the highest shuttle and then she goes to her old house and then she calls the phone number and then she goes to the ballet studio. René is like 'No, Bella! No!' And then it turns out René is not even kidnapped. James, it turns out, it's not about Bella, it's actually about Alice and it's just about revenge and just wanting Edward to come to him. Then he breaks her head and bashes her head in. And she's like 'I just want to die fast.' All of that happen!

J: You covered it, I don't know what to add.

V: You are going to do great! On your mark, get set, go!

J: So, they go to the airport and Bella knows every little knook and cranny of the Phoenix airport. She's waiting for Edward to arrive. She fakes Jasper up by going to the bathroom. He holds her back as he escorts her to the café and that was very weird. Hops on a shuttle, hops on a taxi, gets to her house even though she knows she's going to end up at the ballet studio. V: Relationship updates, eye colour updates, career plan updates.

J: Is that a fax machine?

V: That's the sound of breaking news, Julia.

J: Dodo-do-do. It's breaking news! So, my piece of breaking news honestly shook me to my chore: Bella is not form Phoenix, she's from Scotsdale. Did you notice that?

- V: Which is exciting because we know that Forks doesn't have a rigurous AP programme. Can I now tell you something that I loved about this chapter?
- J: Please!
- V: I mentioned it briefly in my thirty second recap, but I love that James is not obsessed with Bella at all. He's obsessed with Alice. He's like 'I'm not hunting you for you, you don't smell that good. Do you know who smelled amazing? Alice a million years ago.' I feel like it's the same thing as figuring out that the waitress wasn't into Edward. None of these people are as hot as they think they are. That feels true to me. Love the Alice backstory.
- J: I thought it was more like when I used to get chocolate croissant at Costco and then they stopped selling them all of a sudden. I went to great lengths to try to find something similar. This is his journey. He found something really good he loved with Alice and now he's just trying to look for a cheap second. Very relatable.
- V: I thought it was both. Because he's like 'She smelled amazing, you smell fine.' I feel like seeing Alice instigated this whole thing made him realised how much he craves following through on this one. Otherwise that would be such a weird coincidence. It would be like Costco comes back with the chocolate croissant on the same day you finally find your cheap second. Like what are the odds of that.
- J: But the croissant is in the trash. I can no longer eat it.
- V: Exactly, I didn't want to say that.
- J: [laughing] You didn't want to say the croissant was in the trash?
- V: I didn't want to imply that you would still be tempted to eat a croissant in the trash.

[laughing together] J: Oh, I would be!

- V: Well, yeah, that's what I liked. It wasn't about Bella it was actually about Alice. What about you? What did you love?
- J: I loved how dramatic James was. He is hilarious. You are on the scent of the extent he would go for dramatic effect when you wondered what his inner monologue was like. But this chapter we see she walks into the ballet studio and he has a remote control playing the recording he used of René to get Bella to the ballet studio. He pauses it, she looks over. - J: You think Bella finds every single person on this earth hot but for James the vampire?
- V: Every single vampire except the one that is trying to murder her. That is not attractive because she finds Edward hot and he's trying to murder her. So, yeah, I guess James is uggo. That works for him
- J: [laughing] Uggo.
- V: It would be like being the only ugly golden retriever in the whole world. A hundred percent of golden retrievers are gorgeous.
- J: I think that this is his evil backstory. It's like he was an average looking middle-height dude. He gets changed into a vampire, he's still not groundbreakingly hot and he's like 'I guess I just have to murder people. What are my other options here?'

V: Do you have any advice that you want to give?

J: I do have some advice. It's for James. I was really confused about his motives. His branding is not clear. My advice to James is to have a clear villain monologue. He has multiple parts working here. He wants to kill Bella because Edward wanted to have her be alive. 'I want to kill Bella because she reminds me of Alice. Alice is a vampire so that sucks for me.' J: 'He's so sexy I love when he growls.'

- V: Exactly! I think that's fine. You got to pick <u>one</u> topic sentence.
- J: Yeah! Right now, he's working with three.
- V: Too much!
- J: What was your first piece of advice?
